All-Day, All-Week Events: Outdoor Classes, Outdoor Meetings and Tornado Trail Recreation

Long-Loop Preserve Tours: Take a 90-minute guided tour of the Concordia Preserve. Meet in the UFCU Student Center (Building B).

Short-Loop Preserve Tours: Take a 45-minute guided tour of the Concordia Preserve. Meet in the UFCU Student Center (Building B).

Mega-Loop Preserve Tour: On Friday, April 9, you can join us for the three-hour mega-loop tour of the preserve. Meet in the UFCU Student Center (Building B).

Birding Outings: Join a 50-minute bird watching tour of campus and Tornado Trail with Carl and Carol Trovall. Meet at The Pier.

Milkweeds & Monarchs: Learn about the important relationship between milkweed plants and Monarch butterflies as you help the Office of Environmental Stewardship (OES) transplant milkweeds into larger pots. Tools and gloves will be provided.

The presentation includes information about the value of native milkweed plants, especially for the endangered species of the Monarch butterfly. Meet at Luther Park.
