Highlights of an Eventful Spring in CTX Athletics

AUSTIN, TX - The winter and spring sports seasons saw much improvement from a number of teams at Concordia Texas.

The basketball teams both earned berths to the American Southwest Conference tournaments to conclude their seasons. On the men's side, the Tornados finished with 15-11 overall record and 8-6 in ASC play. It marked the squad's seventh straight season over the .500 mark.

The CTX women wrapped up the year at 14-12 and 5-9 in league play. The 14 victories overall were the most since the 2012-13 squad won 17 contests.

The spring campaign saw a couple of ASC championships for the Tornados at both the team and individual level.

Dr. Grant Carey, School of Education, journeyed to Cambodia with 7 Concordia students to do mission work earlier this summer.

During the two week trip, the group worked with homeless children by picking them up from their "homes" each day, bathing them, playing with them, feeding them, and taking them to school. The weather was brutal - over 100 degrees Fahrenheit each day - and there was little to no air conditioning.

They were able to support and serve the staff of the mission organization called <u>Crossing</u> <u>Cambodia</u> by doing some of their normal weekly tasks, such as building projects around their facility and worshiping with them. The team was also able to purchase and assemble a "tuk tuk" (similar to a motorcycle taxi), which the team at Crossing Cambodia will be able to use in their continued ministry.
