COURSE HIGHLIGHTS

Traditions and Values of Classical Civilizations

This course teaches a thematic approach to the contributions of the classical Greek and Roman worlds to Western Civilization.

International Relations Since 1919

In this course, students will analyze world events since 1919 that have affected relationships between nations. Such issues include wars, peace negotiations, economics and social crises.

Race and Ethnic Relations

This course focuses on race and ethnic relations as a national concern.

HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE

History students have had successful internships at various organizations/agencies in Austin, including:

- The Dolph Briscoe Center for American History, working with the photograph collection and preparing an exhibition.
- The Austin History Center, organizing materials for researchers.
- The Texas Historical Commission working on historical markers.

History students can take a semester-long internship for variable credit hours, depending on work hours available. About 50 percent of History majors go on to some graduate school in areas such as history programs, education programs, English programs, seminary or law school.
