the Word.

My pastor tried to hand me a hundred-dollar bill the other week at church. I sat there staring at it unwilling to receive the gift by not opening my hands for him to set it, and not taking the bill out of his hands. He told me "This is for you," and even went on to explain, "you are a college student; you probably need the money." But I still refused to receive his gift. It would have been so easy to receive as he was freely offering it to me. Eventually, my pastor gave up and set the bill on my notebook that was open in front of me. I went home a hundred dollars richer.

We are like this with God. God gave us His grace as a present in the form of His Son, Jesus. He sent His Son down to die for our sins in a painful death, and Jesus rose again in victory over all our sins. Because of Jesus' death, God freely offers us grace. Sometimes we are so stubborn that we are unwilling to receive a gift. If we would just be open to receiving His grace that he so freely offers, we would be able to live in that forgiveness of our sins.


