An example of this could be something as simple as a group project. You wanted a good grade in the class and are an overachiever and think that this is something you can complete on your own but, you have four other classes you need to balance as well, and time has caught up to you. You now have a whole project due tonight by midnight, and you have rejected the help that was offered from the beginning.

READ

The Parable of the Lost Son: Luke 15:11-32



¹¹ Jesus continued: "There was a man who had two sons. 12 The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So, he divided his property between them.13 "Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and there squandered his wealth in wild living. ¹⁴ After he had spent everything. there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need. 15 So he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs. 16 He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything. 17 "When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! 18 I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired servants.' 20 So he got up and went to his father. "But while he was still a long way off. his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him, and kissed him.21 "The son said to him, 'Father. I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'22 "But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. 23 Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. ²⁴ For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So, they began to celebrate.²⁵ "Meanwhile, the older son was in the field. When he

Reflection

based on Scripture:

Notice how in this story, we are told that even though this son had strayed so far away from his father, he was still welcomed with open arms of grace beyond our understanding. This is how God is there for us in each of our lives. No matter how far we stray away. He will always be waiting for us when we return to Him. He wants nothing more than for us to unite with him in the new heaven, and new earth when He returns, and after all, He knows we are imperfect human beings who will fail at temptation every day. He does not receive perfection from us but fulfills what we are unable to do. He invites us daily to return to His grace instead of living life in a pig pin, doubting our identity as daughters and sons of God, and living a messy life on our own. In this story, the Son swallowed his pride to ask his father for just a little place in His father's house as a servant, yet he was received back as a true family member and son. That is more than enough grace.

DIG DEEPER:

Read the first part of Luke 15:1-10

- 1. What is the significance of Jesus leaving the 99 sheep to find the 1 sheep? How have you seen Jesus take this step in your own life to find you?
- **2.** What is the point of the parable of the lost coin?
- **3.** What was the result in heaven after both the sheep and coin were found? How does that affect your purpose and mission with what you do with your own life on earth?

SHARE

Apply to your life:

- **1.** Has there ever been a time in your life where you have felt you have strayed so far away from someone or something that you never thought you could get back? Maybe this was a family member or a friend. What did you do to fix it?
- 2. Do you see yourself as any of the characters in this story? If so, which ones and why?
- **3.** Do you see where the older son is coming from and why he is so angry? Since the younger son now is back in the family, the older son would have had to re-split his leftover inheritance with the younger son. Yikes. I can see why he is ticked off. How can you better sacrifice and empathize with others as they repent and receive grace in their testimony of God's love?
- **4.** This story reminds us of the unconditional love that God has for us. Who is someone that you have shown this type of love to, and how?
- **5.** Can you think of any modern-day examples that require this type of forgiveness and understanding?


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
