
What does it mean to be consistent?

I'm graduating this semester from the DCE program (Kathryn Morgan here) and still haven't decided where I'm going to serve, and work come January 2024. Moving is such a scary task. My move will involve a new car, new tires, finding my cat a home, driving across the country multiple times, and leaving some things behind in Austin. Everything is going to change for me. I will no longer be a student. I will have a real job. Everything is changing. When everything is changing, it's hard to remember that some things never change. That one thing that never changes is God. God never changes, He's always the same, and He's always there for us.

Recently I told a friend that to get God's help we must call upon him. In a particular time when Jesus invited Peter to walk on water with him on the sea, Peter starts drowning after a few steps, and calls out to Jesus. What is interesting to me is that it was only then that Jesus immediately helped him. My friend noted, sure, we need to ask for help, but Jesus wasn't a mile away waiting for Peter to call on Him, He was standing right next to him, ready to help. Jesus is always there, the one thing that can remain constant and consistent in our lives (even when we move out of our Concordia season). Jesus died and rose again so that we could have free access to forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. He took the sins of the entire world on the cross and transferred to us His credit of righteousness.

Jesus is consistently there for us; how can we keep our eyes fixed on him? Perhaps being consistent with quiet time in the word and in prayer.
