When I was 33 years old, I had a pain in my side that wouldn't go away. I went to the doctor a couple of times throughout the week, and the CT scan showed that I had "fluid in my gutter area" so they told me to take some Tylenol and carry on with life. So, I did! The next weekend I was scheduled to lead a Stephen's Ministry retreat for my church. When we got to the retreat center, I spiked a high fever and the pain intensified. The next morning, they drove me back to the emergency room, where they discovered that my appendix had burst a week earlier. Normally, when your appendix bursts, it sends poison throughout your body and results in death. God had graciously allowed a wall of tissue to surround the poison and keep it in place, so I am still alive! I remember how grateful I was for the doctor who removed my appendix, the nurses who assisted in my recovery, and ultimately for God who provided the miraculous wall of tissue that kept me alive.







God is the author of life! Psalm 18 reminds us that he is our strength, rock, refuge, fortress, deliverer, stronghold, and salvation! Though we may be surrounded by spiritual, physical, or emotional enemies of all sorts, God is our helper! The greatest cord that circled our bodies and the distress we found ourselves in is the inability to save ourselves from eternal death and condemnation. Through Christ, we are "saved by Him!" He hears our cries for mercy, and He provides all that we need! Grace is given by faith in Him. And, referring back to my opening story, I love how Jesus too was 33 years of age when he paid for my sins and yours too.
