One of my favorite books, The Road Less Traveled, begins with these words, "Life is difficult." Coming back from winter break, I assume many things were happy about the break, but perhaps many things come into perspective about the difficulties of life. Were your Fall grades not what you wanted them to be? Did your family not get along like you had hoped? Is your financial status not what you would like it to be? Are your relationships not as healthy as you thought? Are you overwhelmed and joyless already on the first week of the semester?

The people of God in the year 600 B.C. were in a difficult spot. God was using Zephaniah to let them know that because of their wicked life and a lack of repentance of their sins, their city of Jerusalem would be destroyed, and they would be carted off to Babylon. Yet, if they repent and turn back to God, they will return to the promised land and be restored.



READ Zephaniah 3:14-17



WHEN LIFE IS - TAKEN FROM -YOU, GOD **HEALS YOU**

(HUMAN TRAFFICKING)

NOTES:

Isarel would be saved and returned to the land of Jerusalem and Judah. A remnant of people that survived would have been saved. Zephaniah urges God's people to fear no evil but instead to rejoice over their coming salvation. Fear may hinder us from witnessing of God's love and mercy; how wrong and foolish that would be! God has redeemed us in Christ. He will always be with us. In fact, amid our unrepentance and sinful choices, He takes great delight in pursuing us with His grace. In our repentance, He takes great delight to even rejoice over us in His own song over the body of Christ (v.17). I am not sure what that song sounds like or the particular lyrics, but may it bring you joy today to know that God loves you, sings over us as His people, and rejoices that we are His no matter how difficult life might get this semester. There is more than enough joy in human life, no matter what you might be facing.

1. How do you typically respond to difficult life situations? How do you turn to God or turn to other methods of coping?

2. Zephaniah called the people of God to repentance. Is there anything specific you or your community needs to repent or turn away from?

3. How do you feel when you read that "in God's love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing"(v17)?
