READ

Wow, that was special. Hopefully hundreds of people connected to Concordia, on campus, in offices and classrooms, and virtually online, have read these verses and inserted their name into the passage. That would mean that hundreds of people like you and I have just had a chance to receive a reminder that we have been redeemed by God.

In ancient times, redemption was a term that was used in the context of one human buying another human to release them from their slavery. Unlike slaves who don't deserve chains but are put under this cruel unjust sentence, humanity received a spiritual slavery of sins by our own actions of rebelling against God's will. The punishment for sinning against God goes beyond slavery but includes deserving eternal death. And that includes us. We were born sinners and kept on sinning from the time we were conceived. Yet, while we were still sinners, Christ Jesus died for us (Romans 5:8). When you were baptized into His name, you were set free from slavery to sin and given a new master, God. And this Master will never hurt you but love you unconditionally through what can be valleys and fires of final exams, breakups, tough job tasks, friendships, parental expectations, and anything you face. By the way, if you haven't received grace through faith in baptism, and you believe in Jesus, let our campus ministry team know and we would love to help get you baptized.
