



ACADEMIC ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
Tarrant County College and Concordia University Texas

I. Introduction

A. General Intent

This document establishes a formal articulation between Tarrant County College (hereafter referred to as “TCC”) and Concordia University Texas (hereafter referred to as “Concordia”). It is based upon a thorough review and analysis of the stated curricula at TCC in relation to the identified curricula at Concordia.

This agreement facilitates the admission of qualified TCC students into a Bachelor’s degree program at Concordia by guaranteeing the transferability of academic college-level coursework according to the attached equivalency statement. The guaranteed transferability of coursework means that all coursework will be evaluated and may be accepted for transfer credit based on the degree program requirements.

B. TCC Profile and Accreditation

Tarrant County College District, a comprehensive two-year institution established in 1965, is dedicated to providing quality education that exceeds the expectations of the people of Tarrant County. Accordingly, the mission is: “Tarrant County College provides affordable and open access to quality teaching and learning.”

Tarrant County College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award the associate degree. TCC's educational programs and courses are approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Memberships also are held in the Texas Association of Community Colleges, Association of Texas Colleges and Universities, and the American Association of Community Colleges.

The semester credit hour is the unit of credit at TCC and is generally defined as the amount of credit given for one classroom hour per week for a 16-week semester. Courses requiring laboratory and many special purpose courses may require additional contact hours per credit hour. All assigned grades adhere to the standard four point grade scale without plus or minus designations (i.e. A, B, C, D).

C. Concordia Profile and Accreditation

The mission of Concordia University Texas is developing Christian leaders. Concordia operates a single residential campus in Northwest Austin, TX, and centers at multiple locations within the state of Texas and for online students. It offers programs in multiple modalities, including on-line and hybrid learning, to meet the needs of a highly diverse and regionally dispersed student population.

Concordia is a committed Lutheran institution of higher education affiliated with The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. It is also a member institution of the Concordia University System, comprised of eight other institutions also affiliated with The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, for the purposes of collaboration, mutual support and undertaking joint ventures.

Concordia University Texas is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award the associate's, bachelor's, and master's degrees. Concordia has a Certificate of Authority from Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for granting degrees at the associate, baccalaureate and masters level.

All course credits are stated in terms of semester credit hours, which are established in accordance with the Federal Definition of the credit hour. All assigned grades adhere to the standard four point grade scale without plus or minus designations (i.e. A, B, C, D).

II. Terms of Agreement on Articulation and Transfer

A. General Articulation on Course-by-Course Basis

Through this general agreement, both parties seek to clearly identify those TCC courses that are equivalent to courses offered by Concordia to ensure accurate advising of students who transfer from TCC to Concordia. Implementation of this agreement should ensure a smoother and expeditious process for TCC students intending to enroll at Concordia.

Course equivalencies are attached as Exhibit A to this articulation agreement and will be updated on an annual basis. All academic college-level coursework completed at TCC will be considered transfer towards meeting the general graduation credit hour requirements for the selected Concordia program where applicable. Only courses for which an awarded grade of "C" or higher was received will be eligible for the awarding of transfer credit.

To simplify transferability of coursework and establishing equivalencies, Concordia voluntarily establishes equivalencies to the Texas Common Course Numbering System (TCCNS). Courses identified by TCC as implementing any of the standard TCCN courses that are listed in the attached equivalency chart are considered for transferability into Concordia with an earned grade of "C" or higher, when applicable to the degree plan. These equivalencies will be published and kept up to date on Concordia's web site, but the current version is included as Exhibit B to this agreement.

B. General Articulation of Texas Common Core

In the event that a TCC student completes the Texas Common Core, as indicated by the statement “Texas Core Curriculum Completed (Month/Year)” on their TCC transcript, courses satisfying the Texas Common Core will not be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Instead, the credit hour requirements of Concordia’s general education core, called the Concordia Common Experience, requirements will be satisfied, regardless of the awarded grade at TCC, with the exception of the Concordia Distinctive. The Concordia Distinctive consists of nine (9) hours and includes the following:

All graduates of Concordia are required to complete the Concordia Distinctive.

C. Articulation from the Associate of Arts (AA) and Associate of Science (AS) Degrees

TCC students who graduate with the Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree with a 2.0 or higher GPA are guaranteed admission to Concordia. All earned academic college-level coursework is eligible for transferability, when applicable to the degree plan. Actual transfer of credit will be conducted according to Concordia’s policies and the agreements in Section II Part A and Part B above.

Note 1: Students who earn a grade of “C” or better in a two-semester sequence of a non-English language (i.e. Spanish I and Spanish II) will satisfy the language requirement for Concordia’s Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree. Students electing to complete one semester of a non-English language for the Humanities requirement at TCC are strongly encouraged to also complete a second semester of that same language at TCC to avoid curricular and pedagogical mismatches between language sequences between institutions.

Note 2: Students planning to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree within the College of Science at Concordia are required to successfully complete calculus and statistics courses. Thus, selection of the following coursework at TCC is strongly recommended: MATH 2413 to fulfill the former requirement and/or MATH 1342 to fulfill the later requirement.

Note 3: Completion of up to nine (9) credit hours outside of the General Education Foundation at TCC within the Elective requirement with a grade of “C” or higher in the same discipline may be used towards the minimum of 18 credit hours required for the designation of a Minor at Concordia, within the provisions stated in the Concordia Academic Catalog under the section Minors.

D. Articulation from the Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) Degree into the Bachelor of Art in Teacher Education Programs

1. General Transfer into Teacher Education Programs

TCC students who graduate with the Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) degree are guaranteed admission to Concordia University Texas. All earned academic college-level

coursework is eligible for transferability, when applicable to the degree plan. Actual transfer of credit will be conducted according to Concordia's policies and the agreements in Section II Part A and Part B above.

Admission to the College of Education, however, is not guaranteed. If the incoming student meets the requirement of a grade of C or better in all course work completed with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5, he/she may apply for admission to the College in the initial education course taken at Concordia. Upon completion of an informal interview and a recommendation from a faculty member from the College of Education, provisional admission may be granted at that time. During the third course in the education sequence, teacher candidates may apply for full admission to the College of Education and the Teacher Education Program. Admission to the Teacher Education Program consists of the following evaluation criteria:

- Evidence of basic skills in reading, writing, and mathematics through satisfactory course completion or performance on standardized tests such as THEA, ACT or SAT, Accuplacer or Compass
- Be a student in good standing with university (per Concordia policy)
- Earn a 2.5 cumulative GPA and 2.5 GPA in all education coursework,
- Two recommendations from Concordia College of Education faculty
- Recommendation for admission from a formal interview with College of Education faculty

Note 1: Approved coursework in both Federal and State/Local Governments is required by the Teacher Education program, so TCC students must have both GOVT 2305 and GOVT 2306 earned from TCC or from equivalent transfer credit. Concordia will offer a one-credit-hour on-line Texas Government course for those that need only this component.

Note2: The College of Education (COE) at Concordia requires successful completion of the following courses for all BA degree plans. The table below shows current TCC courses that will meet these individual requirements:

2. Degree Completion Elementary Level Curriculum Program

Certain Concordia locations may offer a degree completion option in an accelerated delivery format leading to the BA in Elementary Level Curriculum: ECE-6 or 4-8 Generalist. This program is generally delivered in a cohort format that will require the ability to follow a standard full time course plan, including a full semester of student teaching.

E. Articulation from the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing into Baccalaureate Programs

1. General Transfer into the BA, BS or BBA Programs

With successful admission to the BSN program at Concordia, all General Education coursework applied to an AAS in Nursing program at TCC will be eligible for transfer on a course-by-course basis as described in Part A and B of this document. The following General Education requirements will be coded as completed for the AAS awarded students successfully admitted into the BSN degree program.

- Three (3) credit hour Kinesiology (health and wellness) requirement
- Three (3) credit hour Technology requirement

Note: If student leaves the BSN program, both of the above requirements must be met through transferable coursework or by successfully completing courses at Concordia.

For a BS, BA, or BBA degree programs, all General Education coursework applied to an AAS in Nursing program at TCC will be eligible for transfer on a course-by-course basis as described in Part A and B of this document.

F. Articulation from the Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Degrees to the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science (BAAS) Degree

The Concordia Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science (BAAS) degree provides a baccalaureate level foundation grounded in the liberal arts perspective. The program's structure is designed to provide a smoother transfer path into a bachelor degree program from AAS degree programs, which are approved in Texas by the Workforce Commission to meet specific career skill requirements through college credit programs. The structure for the degree creates 4 classifications of credit requirements: the Concordia Common Experience, a coherent technical specialty earned through an AAS degree, a baccalaureate track enhancing the AAS and/or career, and general elective hours. Individualized degree agreements are created for each student in the BAAS program which are signed by the student and the Center Dean. Majors available for Concordia's BAAS degree will be listed in Concordia's Academic Catalog but as of the writing of this articulation there is a single major approved: Technical Management.

TCC students who graduate with an acceptable Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree are guaranteed admission to Concordia Bachelor of Applied Science (BAAS)

degree program. For an AAS degree plan to be acceptable, the AAS program (as published in the official Academic Catalog) must contain a required coherent technical specialty area, which must require at least 9 hours of advanced coursework in the specialty area at the sophomore (2000 course level) or higher, exclusive of any additional transfer coursework at higher levels outside the designated specialty. The following list of AAS programs from TCC are currently accepted for admission into the BAAS program:

Students with documented completion of the Texas Common Core will be evaluated as described in Section II Part B of this agreement. Also, any earned academic college-level coursework is eligible for transferability, when applicable to the degree plan. Actual transfer of credit will be conducted according to Concordia's policies and the agreements in Section II Part A and Part B above.

The admission process may begin in the final semester of enrollment in the AAS program but acceptance will be pending official completion and conferral of the AAS degree at TCC and the receipt of a transcript showing awarding of the degree by Concordia.

III. The Agreement

A. Term, Renewal and Modification

This agreement becomes effective upon signatures of both parties and shall continue in effect indefinitely unless either party wishes to void the agreement. The agreement may be terminated by giving notice in writing. This agreement may be terminated 90 days after written notification is received by either party. In the event of termination, and to the extent reasonable, all decisions related to student enrollment, status or the transfer of credit made based up this agreement will be honored in good faith.

TCC and Concordia agree to consider in good faith any amendments proposed by either party. Any such amendments shall be finalized in writing and will take effect when both parties sign such amendment. Signed amendments related to this agreement are considered a subset of the original agreement and are bound by the same ability to terminate. Transfer and equivalency guides (e.g. Addendum to General Articulation Agreement) will be reviewed and updated at least bi-annually.




