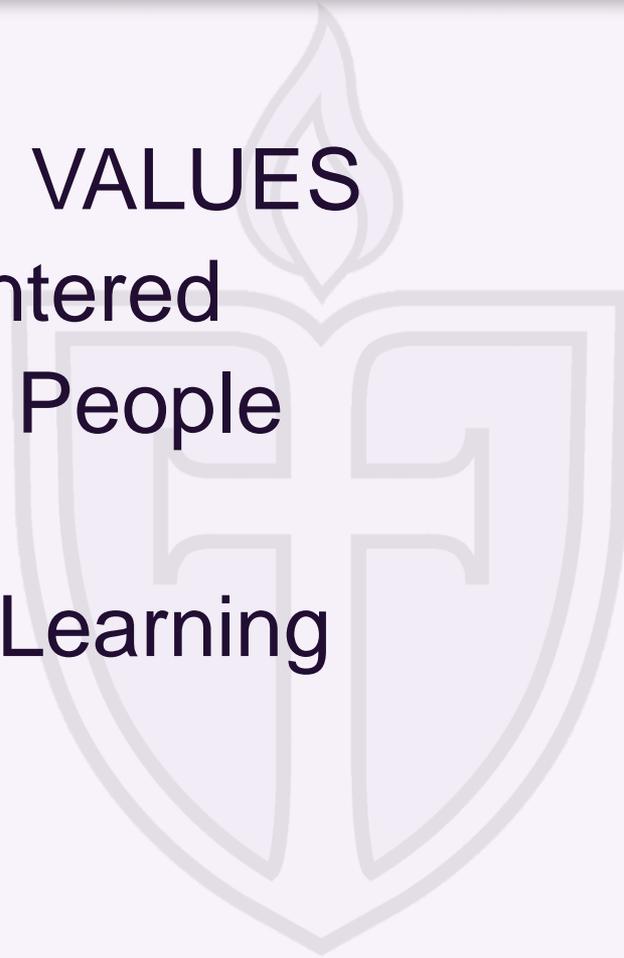

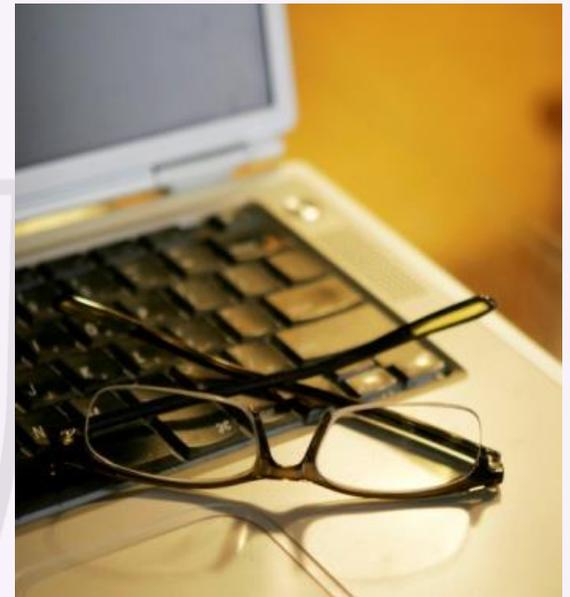

Things to Know about *Jump Start*

***Jump Start* searches all standard databases**

after you enter your search term, you can

- Limit resources by discipline (advanced search) – *highly recommended!*
- Restrict by full-text and scholarly/peer reviewed journals* (limiters on the ***left*** on the main results page) **some non-scholarly stuff like book reviews still get in, but it is a good start (you still have to use your brain!)*
- Grab citations in MLA, APA, or Chicago/Turabian (humanities) format (click CITE option on ***right*** when an item is open).
- There are also ***specialized databases*** by discipline that you can't get from Jump Start or have unique limiters, like Nurse as first author (*CINAHL*) or tools on *Stat!Ref*. Check these out by going to the **Databases** TAB and pick the ones you want (or your instructors suggest) by subject/title.

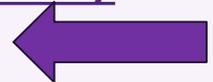

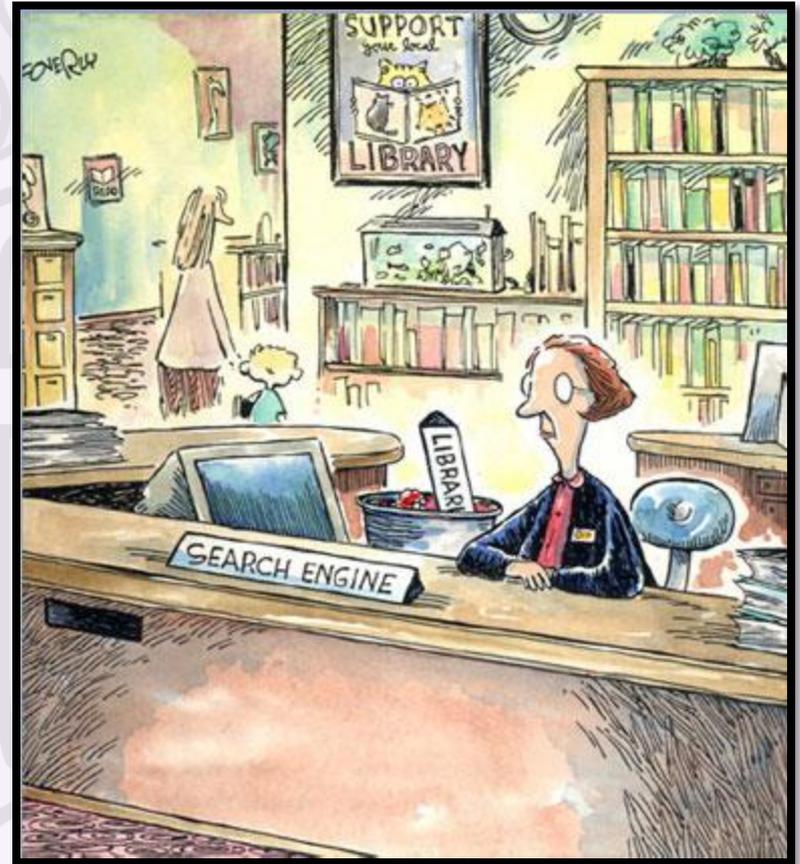

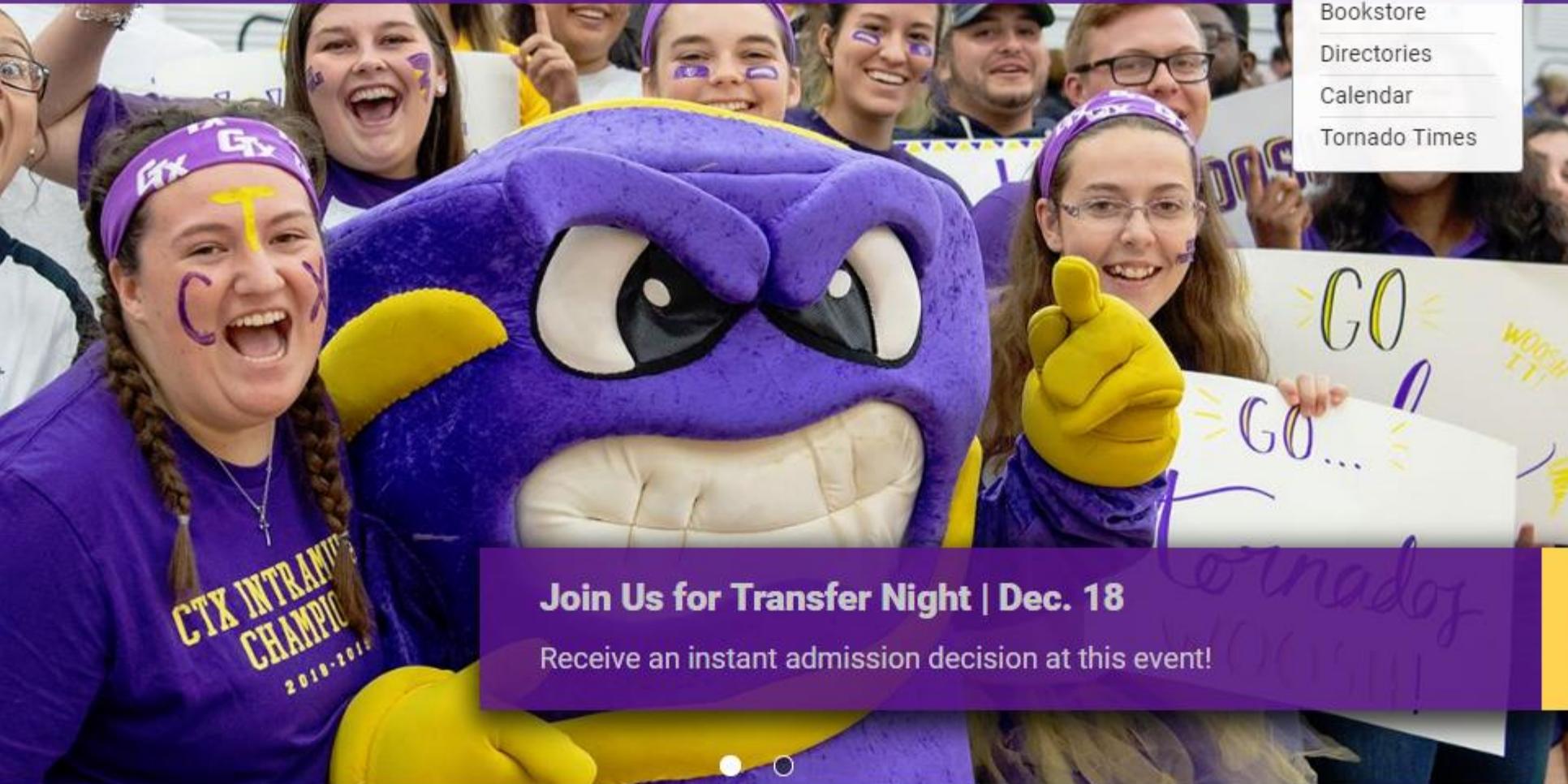
