



PURPLE LOT: Restricted parking & deliveries. Limited space. No visitor parking available.




BLUE LOT: Visitor & employee parking. Handicapped parking is in front of Building A.



We work hard to integrate our mission, vision, and core values into every aspect of our campus. Our core values are being Christ-centered, caring for people, and developing our vocation, life-long learning, trust, and courage.

Building A - Chapel

Building A houses our Chapel. At Concordia, Christ is honored and all are welcome. The primary use of our Chapel is for our campus worship. This time together is who we are and the heart of our campus community. We hold campus worship at 10:00am every day Monday through Friday, and you will see students, faculty, and staff regularly attend worship throughout the week. Our worship reflects thousands of years of tradition and the best of modern songwriting. It's for everyone; there are always ways to get involved in campus worship - last year alone several hundred people were involved in helping our campus worship happen.

We are part of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, so our Christian beliefs are tied to all areas of campus life. Though not all of our students share our Christian faith, everyone is valued, included and cared for.

In addition to campus worship, another regular event that meets in the Chapel is our student worship called 9:09. This takes place every Thursday at 9:09pm and is based off of the verse Psalm 9:9 which describes the Lord as our refuge. This is a time that a lot of the students really enjoy and you are invited check it out!

Building A - Admissions

Also in Building A, are the offices of Admissions Counselors. They are here to assist you with each step of becoming a Tornado from your application and financial aid to registration and everything in between. If you have any questions about enrolling at Concordia, this is your one-stop shop. They are here to help you be a Tornado and take the world by storm.

As you head to the Student Center, here is a little about Concordia's history...

Founded in 1926, we started as a boys' high school with just 26 students. We then became a junior college in 1951, a four-year college in 1980, and a university in 1995. In this year, we were called "Concordia University Austin," but officially became who we are today "Concordia University Texas" in 2007. Since then we have undergone a few mascot changes, moved our entire campus, and grown to be Austin's leading Christian university with over 2,700 students.

A little about our current campus...we sit on 389 acres of land. We moved to this location from downtown in 2008 to have more room and an even more beautiful campus. This property used to be owned by Schlumberger Oil and Gas as their research facilities. We repurposed most of the buildings, but built the gym and residence halls new in 2008.

Building B - Student Center

Welcome to our Student Center! This is where students come to study, hang out, and enjoy Starbucks.

We also have the University Federal Credit Union here for students. They sponsor events like Tornado Tuesday (free food and snacks the 1st Tuesday of every month). There's an ATM available here too.

Building B - Incubator for Innovation and Impact

Our Incubator for Innovation and Impact is a partnership with Tech Ranch Center. Here, students will be able to collaborate with area

entrepreneurs and businesses on various initiatives, projects, and innovations.

Building B - Bookstore

Our bookstore is also located here in the Student Center. Students can rent or buy their textbooks from here, either online or in the store. You can also buy CTX apparel, snacks, and general supplies here.

Building B - Student Activities Office

Our Student Activities Office really makes the student experience here on campus. Our Student Activities Administrator, Meredith Heathcoat, and her team of Student Life Leaders organize all sorts of events and activities - Coffeehouse - our campus wide talent show that happens every semester, Flunch - Free Lunch for commuter students every month, and so much more!

We also have all sorts of clubs and organizations to get involved with. From student government to intramurals, we have something for everyone, but if there is something we don't have, you can start your own group. You can really customize your experience here. Since we are a small community, we customize things the way our students want.

Getting involved is key; you will get so much more out of the college

experience if you are connected and engaged. The Tornado Watch is a fun, weekly student life news stream that Student Activities records and emails out to students so they can keep up with what's happening on-campus!

Building B - Fine Arts Programs

This building also hosts our fine arts programs. In our music department, both majors and non-majors can take music lessons. We even offer private lessons. If theatre is more your thing, you can participate in or attend our plays which are performed each semester here in our Black Box theatre. You can see some of the posters from past productions hanging on the wall. On the lower floor of this building are our art classes, studios, and galleries.

Building C - Entry

We have two main academic buildings; the first of which is Cedel Hall, named after a former Concordia president, Dr. Tom Cedel. Both of our academic buildings have large atriums, floor-to-ceiling windows, and a lot of natural light, creating a thinking-conducive space.

Building C - Student Central

In addition to classrooms, Cedel Hall houses an awesome resource for students - Student Central. This is the place you will probably visit most as a student; it is our one-stop shop for current students. Pretty much anything you have questions about – registration, financial aid, switching majors, etc. – can be answered here. Before taking classes, you work hand-in-hand with Admissions; once you're a current student, our Student Support Coordinators become your people to go to for anything you need.

Walking Down Aisle of Classrooms

As you can see, Cedel Hall is organized with classrooms on the right and faculty offices on the left. The average class size is 15 students to one professor. Feel free to peek inside any open classrooms. The desks and tables in our classrooms have wheels to maximize mobility so that professors can utilize classroom space any way they want: standard lecture format, circle for discussions, divide into groups and debate, etc.

In addition to being intentional with the furniture in the classrooms, we also are intentional about how our classes and offices look from the outside. Our glass offices reflect our open-door policy and value of caring for one another. Professors truly do want to meet and get to know each of their students.

At this end of the building, we also have the Executive Team offices located downstairs. Administrative offices are integrated into classroom buildings, so that everyone working for the institution stays focused on teaching and learning, and how they live out their vocation while keeping student success a priority.



Preserve View from Deck

Right outside of Cedel Hall

Concordia sits on 389 acres of land, 250 of which is federally-protected preserve land. You will get many opportunities to see the preserve as a student here. Our preserve has over 11,000 trees and is home to 3 endangered species: the Golden Cheek Warbler (bird), Black-Capped Vireo (bird), and Jollyville Plateau Salamander.

One of your first opportunities is during your Life & Leadership class, which is a required class for all incoming students. This class is one of our ways to begin fulfilling our mission of Developing Christian Leaders within each student. We want to develop each student personally and professionally, based on our Christian beliefs, to be a leader in whatever their calling.

You also can take advantage of days with open guided tours to explore the preserve, and become a trained guide yourself if

you would like. Finally, our best use of the preserve is as a living classroom for biology and environmental science field work.

Building D - Entry

This is our Science & Technology Building. In this building, we have mostly science classes: nursing, kinesiology, biology, math, and computer science.

Building D - CEO/President's Office

The first office on the left is our President and CEO, Dr. Don Christian's office. Dr. Christian transitioned from the Dean of Business to our CEO and President in the fall of 2014. He is awesome and is very approachable. It's normal for him to introduce himself to students that he hasn't met yet and ask what they're studying, where they are from, and what they like to do.

Building D - Campus Police

Concordia cares deeply for our students, and so we definitely care about safety. You can see our Campus Police Department and the end of the building. Here at Concordia we have security on duty 24/7. We always have security at the gate, and we have security escorts around campus after dark that you can call anytime. Campus Police is also where you get your student ID and your parking pass, which is FREE!

Outside of Building D: Cruciform

The statue located outside of Building D is our cruciform. It was brought over from our historical campus in downtown Austin. This was the first statue associated with our university and originally stood two stories high above campus. It is a reminder for our campus community of our first value: to be Christ-centered as we learn, work, and interact with each other each day.

Building E - Entry

This is our Dining Hall. The best thing about this place is that we offer an all-you-can-eat buffet each meal. Some options are standard everyday - pizza, salads, burgers - but we also have a homemade style meal which changes daily. Our Dining Hall offers 3 meals per day on weekdays and 2 on weekends – brunch and dinner. That way you can sleep in on the weekend.

For all students who live on campus, the meal plan is part of the housing package. For commuter students, we offer a meal plan of 5 meals per week so they can eat on campus too. Anyone is invited to come and purchase a single meal during meal times too!

One of the ways that our great dining staff shows their care for students is by helping students who have allergies or other special dietary needs have access to food that they can eat. They also provide to-go boxes if you have a class or errand and can't stay to eat. If you are sick, then your roommate can pick up a boxed meal for you too!

Library

You may walk inside the Library if it is open.

Building F - Entry Hall by Stairs

This is our library. It is organized with our main book stacks on the bottom floor and our student support services and librarian on this upper level. We have a lot of study rooms on the bottom floor and our treehouse study and prayer room is straight ahead of the entrance.

The librarians are very accessible if you need assistance with your research. You can call or email them. We also have 24/7 librarian live chat online through our website. The library even offers hot cocoa and tea when it gets below 50 degrees outside and snacks during finals week.

Building F - Computer Lab

The library houses one of our computer labs that all students can use. The best part about these computers is that there is free printing. We also have free Wi-Fi all over campus.

Building F - Can-Do Missions, Service Learning

Can-Do Missions is Concordia's mission organization. You can see in the back hallway pictures of various mission trips that students have done through Can-Do. They have a variety of locations where they serve from around Texas, to other states, and even other countries. The lengths of the trips vary too so feel free to come to these offices anytime to talk to Pat and Andrea, who lead the organization, about how you can be involved.

We also have a lot of service learning opportunities through our university. At Concordia, students are encouraged to integrate meaningful community service with instruction and reflection to grow in our values of lifelong learning and caring for others.

Study Abroad, Concordia Exchange

If you're interested in traveling while also getting credit for classes, you can participate in study abroad or travel courses.

We also have a program set up where students can choose to study at another Concordia campus for a semester and just pay the same tuition that you pay here.

Building F - Success Center

The library also houses our Success Center. The Center offers lots of resources to help students succeed while attending Concordia and all of these services and resources are free.

The back hallway wall shows tutors that are available to you throughout the semester. There is tutoring available online or in-person. The great thing about our tutors is that they are easily accessible. You can see here that they post their picture, phone number, and email so that you can contact them whenever you would like and you know who you are meeting.

The Success Center also offers Disability Services so feel free to connect with them if you need any assistance through these services while you are studying at Concordia.

Another service that the Success Center provides is counseling. Feel free to reach out to our licensed professional counselor, Annie, at any time. She is great and would love to talk to you about anything going on in your life that you would like to share.

Building F - Center for Vocation & Professional Development

The Center for Vocation and Professional Development is our career center but with an emphasis on our value of vocation being more than just a job. Career is only one expression of vocation. Roles such as daughter, father, RA, and even student are callings.

Randa, the director of this office, wants to help you explore your vocation at any stage of your college life. This can begin with developing soft skills and personality assessments. You can also come here for help writing a resume, interview prep, networking opportunities, on-campus jobs, off-campus jobs, internships, and mentorships.

Residence Halls



Building G - Weight Room


Our newly renovated weight room opens early and closes late. It's open to all students though there are special hours for our athletic teams to practice together. Our locker rooms are also open to everyone.

Building A - Bell

This bell came over from Liverpool, England in 1854 with a group of Wendish immigrants. They came into Port of Galveston and settled in the Serbin area east of Austin. It belongs to the first Lutheran Church in Texas: St. Paul in Serbin. We’re watching it for them.

Building A - Martin Luther Statue

This Martin Luther statue is the only statue to show Luther as a young scholar. One of our fun traditions is that students like to dress him up for holidays and events. A lot of our students and visitors like to take pictures with him.
