

## The Concordia MBA Admissions Essay Guidelines

The purpose of the essay is to help the Admissions Committee understand you as a whole person, not just a transcript or a professional resume. Think of this as your first assignment as a Concordia MBA student. As you pursue your MBA course work, each instructor will review this essay to help him/her get to know you and the goals to which you aspire.

## Your essay should answer the following framing questions:

- What prevented you from achieving a minimum 2.75 GPA as an undergraduate student and how will you maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA in the MBA program to stay in good standing? More specifically, what is your game-plan for success as an MBA student?
- What is there about your values, goals, commitments, or life purpose that compels you to become a student in The Concordia MBA program?
- What strengths do you bring that will enrich your MBA learning community?

## Your essay will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- 1. Clarity and quality of writing. Please check your essay for appropriate use of grammar, spelling and punctuation.
- 2. Depth and relevance of personal reflection.
- 3. Awareness of broader issues and ideas beyond your personal point of view.
- 4. Effective use of one or two authoritative sources (e.g. magazine articles, books, etc.) to help frame or support your ideas. Cite your sources using <u>Chicago reference style</u>. (See Chicago style guide at <a href="https://owl.purdue.edu/owl/research">https://owl.purdue.edu/owl/research</a> and citation/chicago manual 17th edition/general fo <a href="mat.html">rmat.html</a> and writing tips at <a href="http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/section/1/">https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/section/1/</a>
- 5. Alignment with the program outcomes and design of The Concordia MBA program. Information about The Concordia MBA program outcomes and design can be found at <a href="https://concordia.edu/mba">https://concordia.edu/mba</a>.
- 6. If you have any concerns about your application (e.g. a low undergraduate GPA, lack of work experience, etc...), please address those in your essay.

## Your essay should also:

- 1. Be approximately 600-1000 words.
- 2. Be typed, double spaced and submitted as a Word document to <a href="mailto:admissions@concordia.edu">admissions@concordia.edu</a>.
- 3. Number the pages.
- 4. State your full name, date of submission, and desired program start date on the top of *every* page. *Example: John Candidate*, 9/1/2018, *Fall* 2019.
