Tornado Textbooks

- The Concordia Bookstore will provide all of your required books for rental at \$25 per credit hour. If you take 9 hours, you will be charged \$225. Enrollment in the program is automatic; you don't need to do anything.

Tuition Refunds

- **Before the census date:**
 - 100% refund
 - Students may drop classes by contacting Student Academic Planner
- **After the census date:**
 - 0% refund
 - Students must contact their Student Academic Planner to withdraw

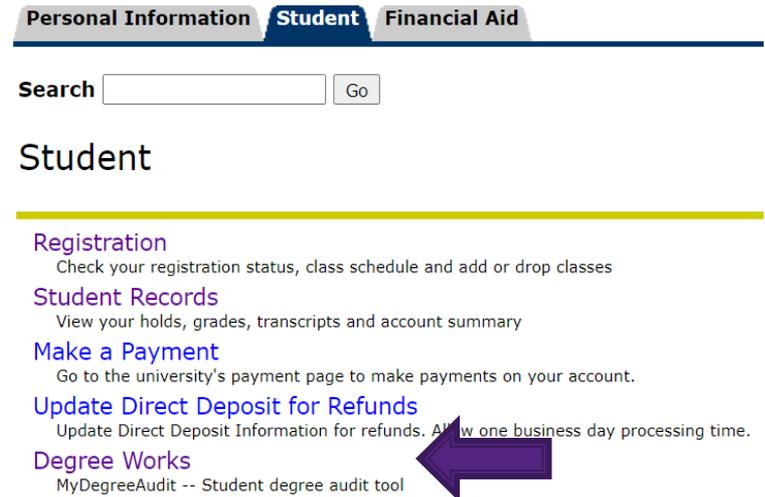


MyInfo Access

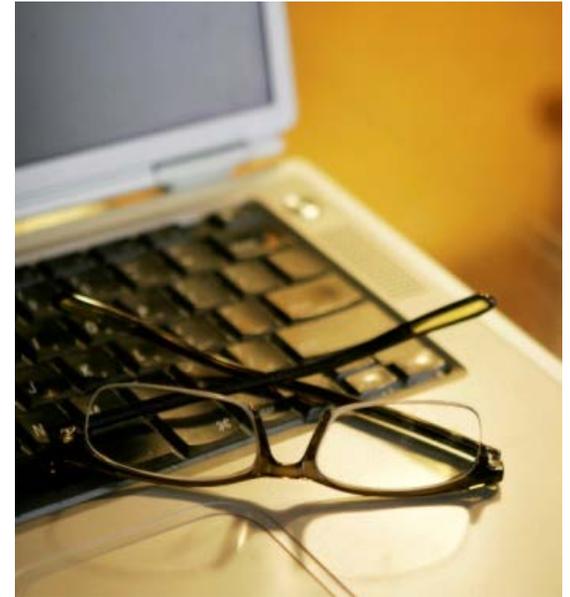

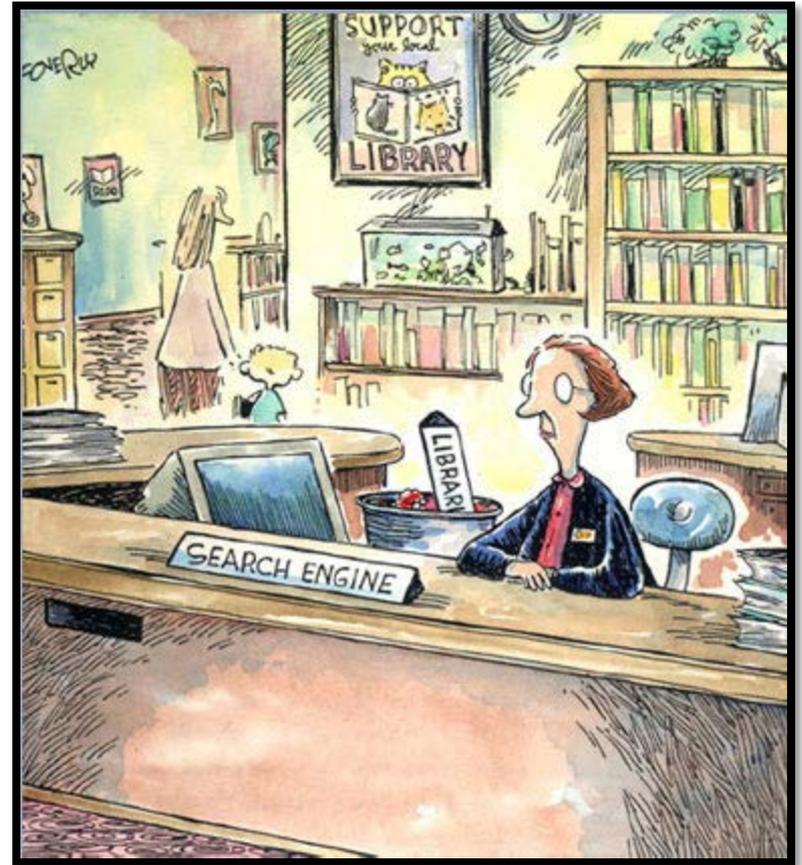

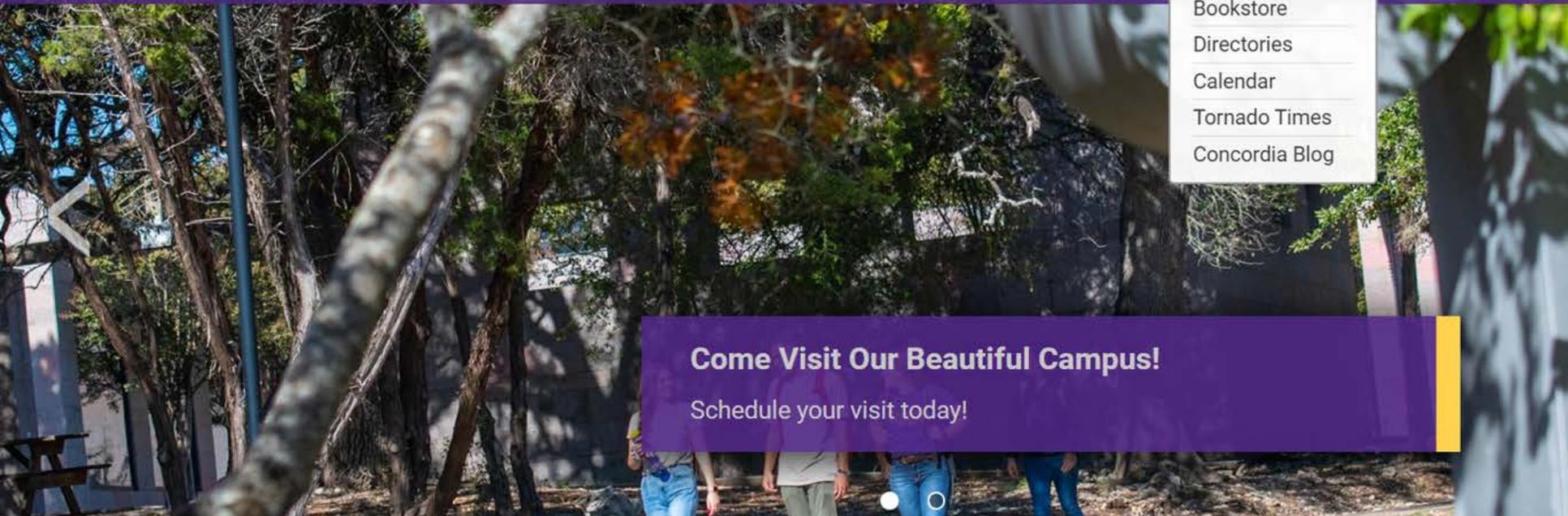

They want to determine how to improve the lesson plan for future use.

Question

In preparation for Mr. Jackson's meeting with the teachers, he plans to review the documents so he is ready to provide input and guide the teachers during the meeting.

1. Identify the **TWO** most important areas of the lesson plan needing improvement. Justify why you selected each area of focus.
2. Create an exemplar that can be used to demonstrate a high-quality example of **ONE** of the identified areas needing improvement.
 - (An exemplar is an example or model that has the characteristics of a high-quality response. An exemplar is a concrete illustration of the evidence needed to meet a desired standard.)
3. Explain how Mr. Jackson should use the exemplar to coach the teachers in the area needing improvement

Be specific in your answers and cite evidence from the documents provided.

- Study the levels of Bloom
- Review campus curriculum

Instructions

Prepare a written response that covers the following elements. 300 to 500 words.

- Identify your campus level of instruction (What level of Blooms is most predominant on your campus? This is based on your review of Bloom's taxonomy and your personal perception.)
- How is this current level of instruction aligned to your district approved teacher evaluation? How teachers are expected to improve their instruction in your district? (i.e. – do you use the state T-TESS evaluation system or a local system and how teachers are expected to use higher types of thinking?)
- Compare/contrast the campus curriculum to levels of thinking. Review your curriculum documents. What level of Blooms is most predominant in those documents?
- Present a significant challenge that might be impeding student learning. From your review, you should be able to identify an instructional area that could be improved. Look at your district curriculum and classroom instruction through the lens of a campus leader. In the role of assistant principal or principal it will be your responsibility to support teachers in the continuous improvement process.
